



**Purpose:** All employees shall wear proper attire associated with their position.

**Scope:** All elected officials and all employees within all positions and all departments of Miawpukek First Nation. Also, all those renting spare offices of Miawpukek First Nation Offices.

**Interpretation of Inappropriate Attire:**

**Mondays through Thursdays**

**Too Casual-** exercise attire, tube tops, string or spaghetti straps, halter tops, rain-gear if working inside, hats/caps, T-shirts with negative logos, blue denim attire with the exception of skirts.

**Provocative** - bare navels, muscle shirts, sheer blouses, low necklines, mini-skirts, skorts, and shorts must not be greater than 3” above the knee.

**Fridays (weekends if applicable)**

Friday is considered “Casual Day”. Jeans, walking shorts, casual shirts, casual shoes and splash pants are permitted provided they are in good condition. Keep in mind all appointments with customers, suppliers, or vendors and dress appropriately.

All casual attire is acceptable except: Pajamas, Negative Logos, Torn/Dirty Attire

As stated above, no provocative or too casual attire permitted at any time (listed for your information above)

**Note: All employees and elected officials are encouraged to wear Mi’kmaq Traditional Dress at any time.**
